

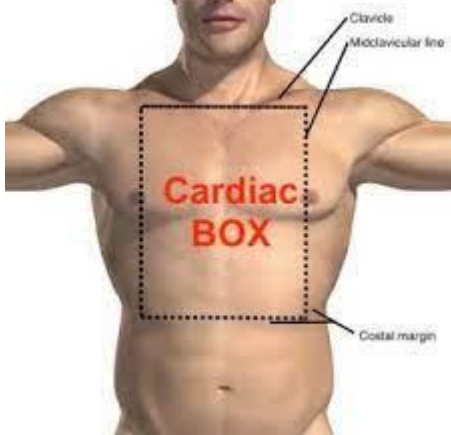


A	AGE, SEX, NAME, D.O.B. Age and sex of casualty (demographic)
T	TIME OF INCIDENT AND ESTIMATED TIME OF ARRIVAL Plus the time of incident
M	MECHANISM OF INJURY This should include: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The gross mechanism of injury (e.g., motor vehicle accident or stab wound to the chest) and• Details of other factors known to be associated with major injury e.g., entrapment, vehicle rollover, occupant ejected from vehicle
I	INJURIES SUSTAINED Seen or suspected
S	SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Vital signs including heart rate, blood pressure, respiratory rate, oxygen saturation and Glasgow Coma Score• An indication as to whether the physiological state of the patient has improved or deteriorated since first seen
T	TREATMENT GIVEN What treatment was given?
